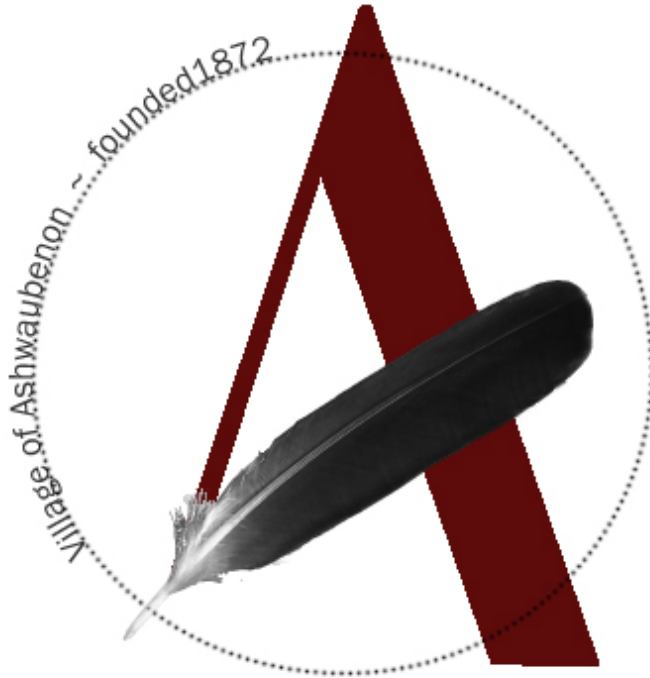

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Chapter 8 - Civil Emergencies

Article 1 - Emergency Management

8-1-19 Definitions

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Emergency management means the preparation for and carrying out of all emergency functions, other than functions for which the military forces are primarily responsible, to minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from disaster caused by enemy attack, sabotage or other hostile action or by fire, flood or other natural causes. The term "emergency management" includes "civil defense."

8-1-20 Emergency Management Director

- (A) *Authorization.* The village president shall serve as emergency management director for the village or may appoint an emergency management director.
- (B) *Duties.* The Emergency Management Director shall be the executive head of the village emergency management organization and shall have direct responsibility for the organization, administration and operation of such organization, subject to the direction and control of the village president and the village board. In addition to such powers and responsibilities as may be imposed on them from time to time by the village board, they shall:
- (1) Coordinate all activities for emergency management within the village; and
 - (2) Maintain liaison and cooperate with emergency management agencies and organizations of other political subdivisions and of the state and federal governments; and
 - (3) Participate in county and state emergency management activities upon request; and
 - (4) Prepare a comprehensive general plan for the emergency management of the village and present such plan to the village board for its approval; and
 - (5) Upon the declaration of an emergency, issue all necessary proclamations as to the existence of such state of emergency and such disaster warnings or alerts as are required by the emergency management plan.
- (C) *Assistants.* Such deputy and assistant directors may be appointed by the Emergency Management Director, subject to the approval of the Village President and Village Board, as may be deemed necessary. Such appointees shall receive such compensation as the village board may determine.

Article 2 - Emergency Preparedness

8-2-44 Utilization of Existing Services and Facilities

In preparing and executing the emergency management plan, the emergency management director shall utilize the services, equipment, supplies and facilities of the existing departments and agencies of the village to the maximum extent practicable. When the village board has approved the plan, all municipal agencies and departments of the village shall perform the duties and functions assigned by the approved plan.

8-2-45 Declarations of Emergency

The emergency management organization shall take action in accordance with the emergency management plan only after a declaration of emergency and the issuance of official disaster warnings. Declarations of emergency shall be made by the governor, the village board or the village president or, in his absence, by the director of administrative services. Such state of emergency shall continue until terminated by the issuing authority, provided any declaration not issued by the governor may be terminated by the village board.

8-2-46 Emergency Regulations

Whenever necessary to meet an emergency for which adequate regulations have not been adopted by the village board, the village president or, in their absence, the emergency management director, may proclaim, promulgate and enforce orders, rules and regulations relating to the conduct of persons and the use of property which are necessary to protect the public peace, health and safety, to preserve lives and property and to insure cooperation in emergency management activities. Such proclamations shall be posted in three public places and may be rescinded by resolution of the village board.

8-2-47 Obstruction of Emergency Management Organization; Penalty

No person shall willfully obstruct, hinder or delay any member of the emergency management organization in the enforcement of any order, rule, regulation or plan issued pursuant to this chapter or violate any order, rule, regulation or plan issued pursuant to the authority contained in this Chapter.
