
OCTOBER'S SENIOR ADVISORY COUNCIL

Angie's List, is one place to look for someone that is recommended by your neighbors. Going to angieslist.com, you will find providers of almost any maintenance service one would need. There is a requirement to sign up for membership to access this information. Angie's List has 3 options for membership: Green, Silver, or Gold. The Green Membership is FREE! Subscribers to the List are the people that

rate the providers. All evaluators of services are verified as actual customers. Scoring is based on an A-F scale, if a provider falls below a B or does not respond to a complaint, they are "kicked" off the list! The site also encourages providers to post special coupons for services they provide.

Word of mouth is a great way to get a name, but it only limits it to those you know! If anyone is willing to put THEIR name behind a handyman THEY use, we will compile a list and send it out via email.
